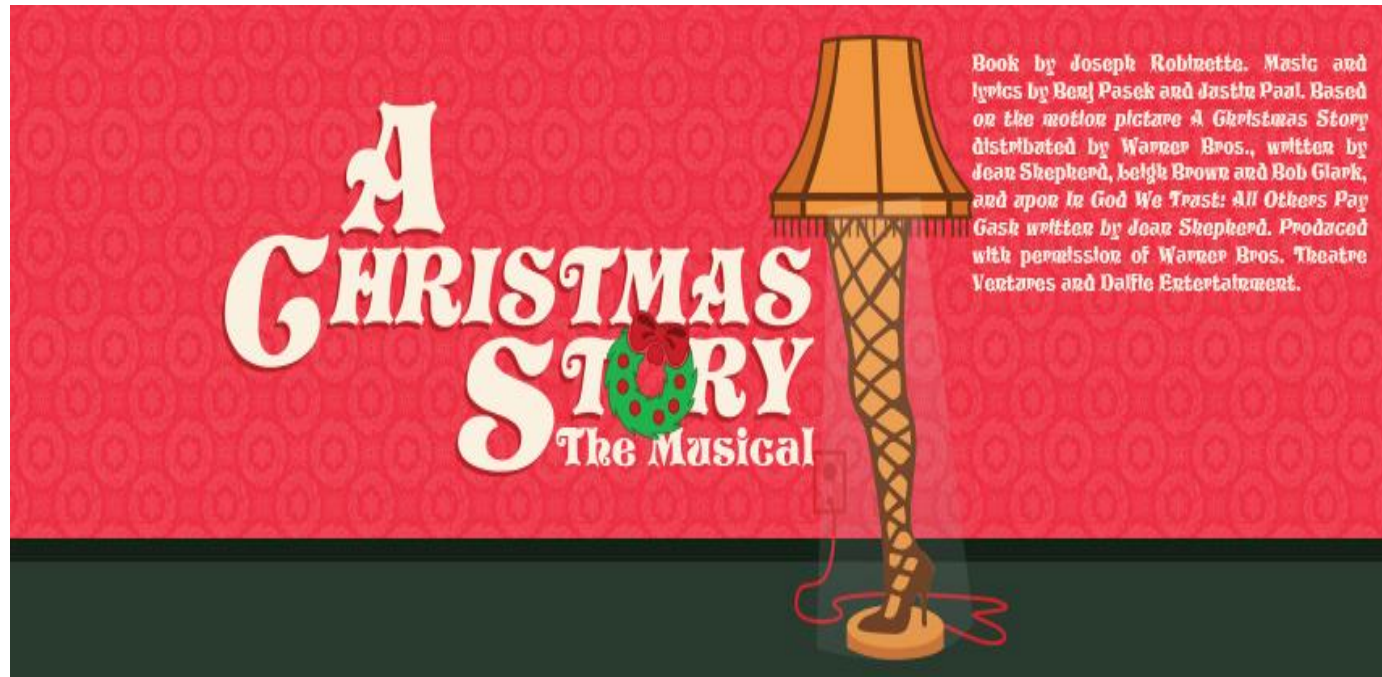




Going to a Play

We will enter door number 14.



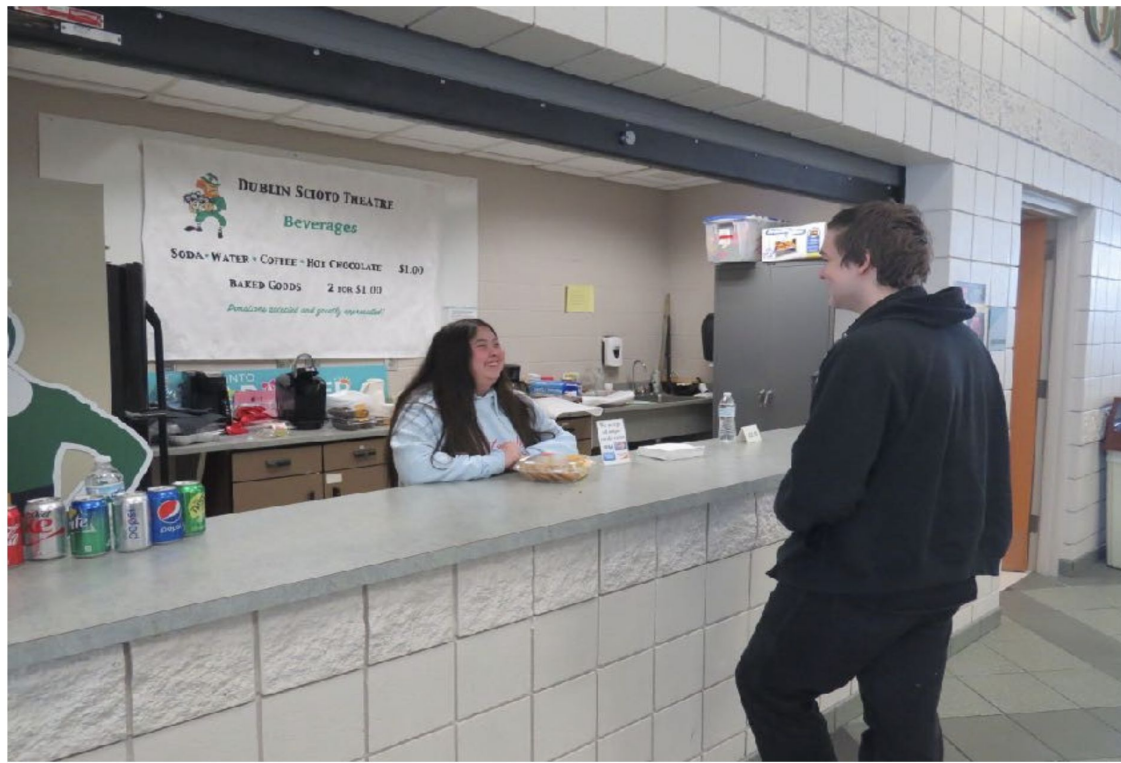
The theatre is called the Marina Davis Performing Arts Center. We might have to stand in line to buy tickets at the ticket office.



If I need to use the restroom, there is one to the right by the ticket office.



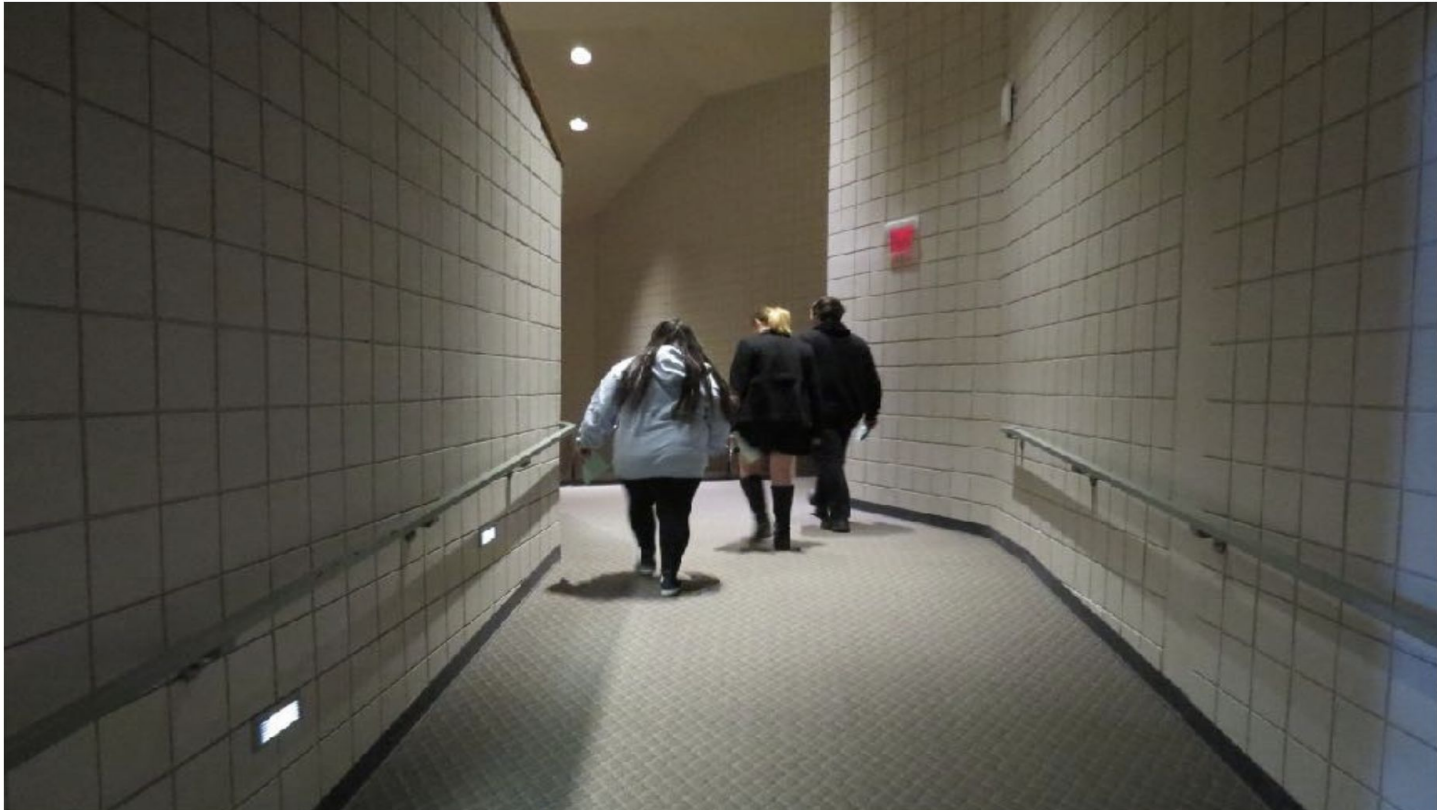
Part way through the play, there will be an intermission. An intermission is a short break. During intermission, I can go out of the theatre. If I go up these stairs, there will be an activity and a place for me to walk around.



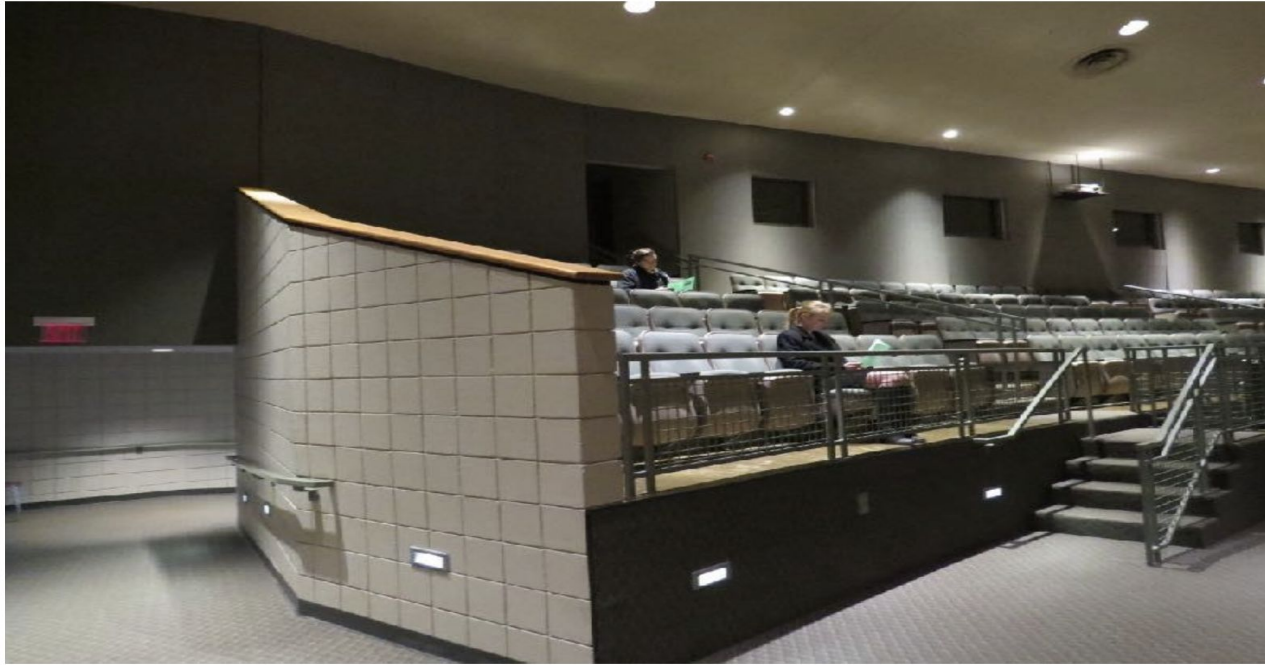
If my adult says it's OK, we can buy a snack or a drink, but I should eat it outside of the theatre. People are not supposed to eat or drink in the theatre.



Before the play begins, we will get in line to go into the theatre. Someone will be at the door to help us if we need it or answer questions. The line may seem long, but it will move quickly.



We will walk up the ramp and choose our seats.



When it is time for the play to start, the lights will be dimmed so we can see the stage better. Someone will make some announcements before the play begins. They will tell us what the signal will be for anything loud or surprising, so I don't need to worry that I will be surprised during the play.



I should try to sit quietly to watch the play.



If I need to move a little bit, I can walk around in front of the seats or in the aisle.



If I need to take a break from watching the play, we can go through the doors at the back of the theatre. There is a break area there. We can watch the play on a monitors in the lobby.



At the end of the play, we will clap for the actors. It might be crowded as everyone tries to leave the theatre. I can wait in my seat until it is not so crowded and noisy.



The actors may be outside the theatre. I can go up to them if I want to and shake their hands. I can say, “I liked the play,” or “Good job!”.
